§ 103-15.2 Notification listing fee.
[Added 4-6-1998 by L.L. No. 2-1998]

[The] Upon request, the involved department will create a listing of all names and addresses, mailing labels, and a map of all adjoining landowners within 500 feet of a parcel under consideration for subdivision, variance, special use permit or site plan pursuant to §§ 179-15.1, 208-79D(2), 208-109C(2)(d), 208-109C(3)(d), and 208-115F. The fee [is \$3 per parcel to be notified with a minimum charge of \$50 and maximum charge of \$500] of \$50 is payable at the receipt of the list. This service is not mandatory.

§ 208-109 Board of Appeals.

(3) Area variances.

(d) [Notifications. The formal notifications as required for use variances in § 208-109C(2)(d) above will not normally be required in the case of a request for an area variance. However, if the situation warrants it, the Chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals may require the applicant to accomplish such notifications.] Notification requirements.

(1) Applications for area variances for residential uses.

The following persons shall be notified at least 10 days prior to the first hearing on an application for area variances by owners of residential property: all owners of property abutting, contiguous to or adjacent to the property for which the variance is sought.

(2) Applications for area variances by non-residential uses.

The following persons shall be notified at least 10 days prior to the first hearing on an application for an area variance by owners of non-residential property: owners of all property within 500 feet of the perimeter of the subject parcel.

(3) In each case, the notification shall identify the subject parcel for which the variance is sought, a brief summary of the relief sought, the time of the first public hearing, thereon, and a statement that the application may be reviewed in the Building Department during normal business hours, please call the Building Department at 371-6651 if you have any questions about the process for consideration.

C. Powers. The Board of Appeals shall have the following powers:

- (1) [Orders, requirements, decisions, interpretations and determinations.] Review of Administrative Determinations. The Board of Appeals may reverse or affirm, wholly or partly, or may modify the order, requirement, decision, interpretation or determination appealed from and shall make such order, requirement, decision, interpretation or determination as in its opinion ought to have been made in the matter by the administrative official charged with the enforcement of such ordinance or local law and to that end shall have all the powers of the administrative official from whose order, requirement, decision, interpretation or determination the appeal is taken.

D. Special Procedures relative to appeal for administrative review or variance.

(4) Notification requirements.

- (a) Applications for review of administrative determinations for residential uses. The following persons shall be notified at least 10 days prior to the first hearing on an application for review of administrative determinations by owners of residential property: all owners of property abutting, contiguous to or adjacent to the property for which the review is sought.
- (b) Applications for review of administrative determinations by non-residential uses. The following persons shall be notified at least 10 days prior to the first hearing on an application for a review of administrative determinations by owners of non-residential property: owners of all property within 500 feet of the perimeter of the subject parcel.
- (c) In each case, the notification shall identify the subject parcel for which the review is sought, a brief summary of the relief sought, the time of the first public hearing, thereon, and a statement that the application may be reviewed in the Building Department during normal business hours, please call the Building Department at 371-6651 if you have any questions about the process for consideration.
- (d) Proof of notification shall be filed with the Board prior to the hearing on the application.

Resolution No. _____ of 2016, a resolution authorizing the Supervisor to proclaim March 2016 as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month.

Introduced by _____, who moved its adoption, seconded by _____.

Whereas, *The Town of Clifton Park* joins to support observances that raise awareness of health issues that affect people across our state, nation, and the world, such as the various types of cancer, including colorectal cancer; and

Whereas, colorectal cancer is a leading cause of cancer-related deaths among men and women in the United States; each year in New York State, nearly 10,000 people develop colorectal cancer and close to 3,500 New Yorkers die from this disease; it is estimated that one in twenty people will develop colorectal cancer during their lifetime; and

Whereas, colorectal cancer occurs most often in older people; approximately 60% of people newly-diagnosed with colon cancer are age 65 and older, and 90% of all colorectal cancers are diagnosed after age 50; and

Whereas, about 75% of colorectal cancer occurs in people who have no known risk factors; while the causes of colorectal cancer are not well understood, scientists agree that the following factors increase a person's risk of developing this disease: age, family history and hereditary conditions, personal health history, obesity, physical inactivity, diet, and other lifestyle factors such as cigarette smoking and excessive alcohol use; and

Whereas, colorectal cancer often can be prevented through regular screenings that can detect small growths, called polyps, which can be removed before they develop into cancer; screening for colorectal cancer is a covered benefit through Medicaid as well as health plans participating in the New York State of Health, and the New York State Cancer Services Program offers colorectal cancer screening to eligible uninsured individuals in every county and New York City borough; and

Whereas, in support of the statewide and national goals to screen at least 80% of age and risk-appropriate men and women for colorectal cancer, New Yorkers and people everywhere are called upon to raise their awareness of colorectal cancer and take preventive steps to safeguard their health and that of loved ones from this disease;

WHEREAS, by Local Law No. 2 of 1968, the County of Saratoga adopted weighted voting for membership on the County Board of Supervisors based on the population of its constituent municipalities, and

WHEREAS, Saratoga County Local Law No. 2 provided that Clifton Park would be represented by two Supervisors on the County Board including an At-Large Supervisor who is not a member of the Town Board, and

WHEREAS, By Local Law No. 2 of 2016, the County of Saratoga provided that in the event of a vacancy in the office of the second supervisor, who is not a member of the Town Board, the vacancy shall be filled in accordance with applicable provisions of the Town Code, and

WHEREAS, on February 16, 2016, the Town Board held a Public Hearing, duly noticed, to receive comments from the public on a proposal to provide for the filling of such vacancies by majority vote of the members of the Town Board, and

WHEREAS, all members of the public who wished to be heard provided such comment, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby adopts local law No. _____ of 2016, a local law amending chapter 33 of the Town Code, attached, and be it further

RESOLVED, that local law No. 1 of 1992 is repealed and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is directed to publish notice thereof.

LOCAL LAW NO OF 2016

33-6 This Article shall be known as "A Local Law Establishing the Procedure for Filling a Vacancy in the Office of a County Supervisor who is not a Town Board Member."

33-7 Pursuant to Local Law No. 2 of 1968, as amended, the County of Saratoga adopted a system of weighted voting which provided that the composition of the County Board of Supervisors consists of two County Supervisors from Clifton Park, including an At-Large Representative from the Town on the County Board. The County of Saratoga is currently considering a proposal to provide that vacancies in the office of the Second County Supervisor from the Town of Clifton Park shall be filled in accordance with applicable provisions of the Clifton Park Town Code.

33-8 This article is set forth pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law § 10, Subdivision 1, Paragraph (ii)d(3), which provides a Town with supersession authority. This section of law provides that a Town may amend or supersede "any provision of the Town Law relating to the property, affairs or government of the Town or to other matters in relation to which and to the extent to which it is authorized to adopt local laws by this section, notwithstanding that such provision is a general law, unless the legislature expressly shall have prohibited the adoption of such a local law." The Town Board specifically desires to act by local law in order to establish the procedure for filling a vacancy in the Office of the Second, or At-Large, Supervisor representing the Town of Clifton Park on the Saratoga County Board of Supervisors.

33-9 Procedure

In the case of a vacancy in the office of the County Supervisor, who is not a member of the Town Board, the Town Board or a majority of its members may appoint a qualified person to fill the vacancy. The person so appointed shall hold office for the remainder of the unexpired term.

WHEREAS, The Farmland Protection Program provides grants to working farms, funded 75% by the State Department of Agriculture and Markets, with a 25% local match to be distributed over 5 years, and

WHEREAS, the incentive payment agreement requires that working farms receiving grant funds continue to operate throughout the terms of the agreement, as follows:
