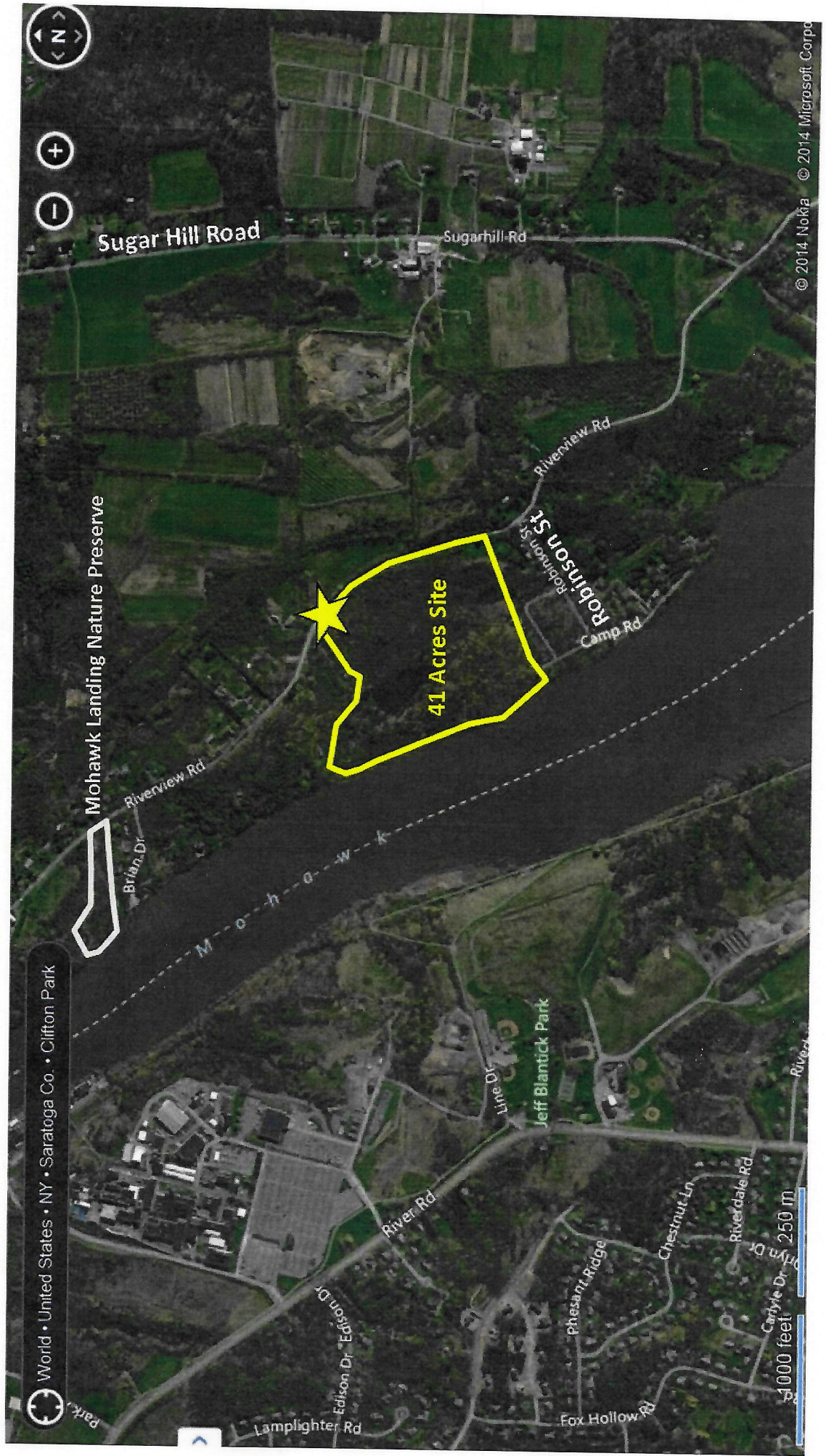

**The General Store and Post Office, Clifton Park, Village
Added to the Clifton Park Register of Historic Places**

The General Store and Post Office on the southwest corner of Route 9 and Old Route 146 (Fire Road) is now occupied by Clifton Park Pizza. The origin of this building can be traced back to 1844 when John P. Higgins of Waterford leases the property consisting of a quarter acre on the southeast corner of present day Route 9 and Fire Road to Shubael Taylor of Clifton Park. However there is a stipulation in the lease that "said premises shall never be occupied as a tavern or house of entertainment or for the purchase of selling liquors to be drank on the premises" (Saratoga County Deeds, Book 72, Page 319).

It appears that by 1855, Joseph Wiltsey, has acquired the property from Higgins as he leases the property on which the store now stands to Gilbert Clements (Saratoga County Deeds, Book 93, Page 413). Wiltsey appears on the 1856 map of Clifton Park as the owner of the store. Evidently Gilbert Clements eventually acquired the store from Joseph Wiltsey, because in 1866, Gilbert and his wife Catherine Millicent sold the property to Adam V. Pearse (Saratoga County Deeds, Book 103, Page 487). This is confirmed on the 1866 Beers map of Clifton Park Village that indicates that Adam V. Pearse owns the store.

In 1882, Elizabeth Schermerhorn of Halfmoon sells this same property in Clifton Park Village along with the store to Jacob Boyce, also of Halfmoon (Saratoga County Deeds, Book 160, Page 490). A circa 1885 photograph of the store with people posed in front along with the owners reveals a sign over the store containing the name "Jacob Boyce." In 1896 the store is owned by Charles Boyce (Saratoga County Deeds, Book 212, Page 181). An circa 1910 postcard view of the store taken by Parker Goodfellow show a sign indicating that by this time the store and post office is being run by H. F. Barrett.

The store appears to have been moved back and placed on a new foundation when Route 9 was widened from a single lane dirt road sometime in the late 1920s or early 1930s. Remarkably, although the first floor has been given over to changes to accommodate the pizza business, much original fabric of the building remains on the second floor, including the original hoist mechanism used to hoist produce for storage to the second floor through the still existing loft door.

WHEREAS, Chapter 208-78 of the Clifton Park Town Code through Resolution No. 16 of 1999, established a Town Register of Historic Places; and

WHEREAS, local honorary listing of buildings, structures, objects, sites and historic districts deemed by the Historic Preservation Commission to be of significant historic value, are eligible for inclusion within the register, and

WHEREAS, inclusion within the local register does not require or cause the property owners on the Historic Register to have restrictions on what they may do with their property, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Clifton Park Historic Preservation Commission has recommended the following properties, each containing a historic building formerly utilized as a one-room schoolhouse, for inclusion within the Town's Register of Historic Places:

1. 943 Riverview Road – Former School District #1. Now a private home owned by Frances Gangi-Welge and Mark Welge at 943 Riverview Road, moved from its original site on the northeast corner of Route 146 and Riverview Road to make room for a new two room schoolhouse, now demolished.
2. 343 Riverview Road – Former School District #3. Constructed in 1848, is now a private home in the Vischer Ferry Historic District owned by Colin Campbell at 343 Riverview Road. The school features a recessed porch characteristic of the Greek Revival style.
3. 1355 State Route 146 – Former School District #7. Corner of Route 146 and Waite Road, referred to as Waite's Corners School, now a private home owned by John Burns at 1355 Route 146. The original blackboards are still intact.
4. 965 Main Street – Former School District #9. Jonesville, located at 965 Main Street Jonesville near the Methodist Church, now a private home owned by Rob and Marie Strait. This school was replaced in about 1905 by the old Jonesville Academy building.
5. 744 State Route 146A – Former School District #10. Elnora, on Route 146A, opposite the intersection of Kinns Road and Route 146A, now privately owned by Paul Rezuchi of Alameda, California, who owns a number of one room schoolhouses throughout the United States. About 20 years ago the Elnora schoolhouse was moved closer to the road and placed on a new foundation;

**One Room Schoolhouses in Clifton Park
Added to the Clifton Park Register of Historic Places**

At one time there were 16 school districts in Clifton Park, each with a one room schoolhouse. This was a result of a New York State Law passed in 1812. Many of these schools were in use throughout Clifton Park until the school districts were centralized in 1950 and the new Shenendehowa School opened for classes in 1953. The one room schoolhouses held multiple classes from first through 8th grades, and the teachers would call the classes up individually to a bench for reciting their lessons. Thus one class could learn from another. Each school had a bell that called the students to class in the morning and after lunch. In 1953, the bells from the remaining schools were placed in a bell court at Arongen and are now in a bell tower in front of the high school. There were no high schools in Clifton Park prior to 1953 and pupils would need to attend high schools in adjacent towns or cities.

The Jonesville Academy at 962 Main Street, now a private home owned by Victor Temple, was used as a private school from 1839 to 1876, was later used as a public school by 1905. It is currently on the Clifton Park Register of Historic Places, as is the schoolhouse for School District 5, at 344 Moe Road, on the corner of Moe and Grooms Road, built in 1903 to replace an earlier building. It now serves as a Nursery School, the only one room school still being used for educational purposes.

Added to the Clifton Park Register of Historic Places are the remaining one room schoolhouses that exist in Clifton Park.

- School District 1: Rexford, now a private home owned by Frances Gangi-Welge and Mark Welge at 943 Riverview Road, moved from its original site on the northeast corner of Route 146 and Riverview Road to make room for a new two room schoolhouse, now demolished.
- School District 3: Vischer Ferry, constructed in 1848, is now a private home in the Vischer Ferry Historic District owned by Colin Campbell at 343 Riverview Road. The school features a recessed porch characteristic of the Greek Revival style.
- School District 7: Corner of Route 146 and Waite Road, referred to as Waite's Corners School, now a private home owned by John Burns at 1355 Route 146. The original blackboards are still intact.
- School District: 9: Jonesville, located at 965 Main Street Jonesville near the Methodist Church, now a private home owned by Rob and Marie Strait. This school was replaced in about 1905 by the old Jonesville Academy building.
- School District 10: Elnora, on Route 146A, opposite the intersection of Kins Road and Route 146A, now privately owned by Paul Rezuchi of Alameda, California, who owns a number of one room schoolhouses throughout the United States. About 20 years ago the Elnora schoolhouse was moved closer to the road and placed on a new foundation.

9. Alcoholic beverages are not to be consumed by team members during athletic team competition.
10. You must be at least 21 years of age to purchase an alcohol permit.
11. Permit Request must be submitted at least 30 days prior to rental date.

2. Area and facility must be left clean. Any damage incurred is the responsibility of the permit holder.
3. Town of Clifton Park park rules (see attached) shall be adhered to. Immediate termination of the event and removal from the premises may occur by an authorized representative of the Town if in violation of these rules and regulations.
4. Obnoxious behavior or excessive noise will not be permitted.
5. Permit holder must retain permit and make available upon request by park or police official.
6. Open containers of alcoholic beverages are prohibited in all parks, unless a permit has been issued which allows for the consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises for which the permit has been issued. Such permits are authorized solely by the Town Board via resolution. A separate "Special Alcohol Use Permit Request" form must be submitted with this form.
7. Permits are available through Clifton Park Office of Parks, Recreation and Community Affairs and must be posted at the facility rental site.
8. Permit holder may be required to obtain and show proof of insurance naming Town of Clifton Park as an "Additional Insured".

I have read the Town of Clifton Park rules and the above special conditions and agree to abide by them. I understand there is a **no refund policy** on this rental. The town will work with me on rescheduling when possible, if needed.
