The regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Clifton Park was held in the Town Office Building at 7:00 p.m., Supervisor Barrett presiding.

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Supervisor Barrett thanked all involved with the successful Hazardous Waste Day that included the Towns of Halfmoon, Malta and Ballston. He reminded residents of Farm Fest scheduled for September 19th and 20th, Pet Adoption Clinic at the Sr. Center on October 3rd, and Shredding Day to be held October 4th from 1 to 3 pm.

The Supervisor reviewed the fiscal results of the ice arena noting a profit of \$18,199. He said Scott Bobrow will be at a future meeting.

Councilwoman Standaert announced a Youth Court informational meeting will be held September 17th in the high school for any interested students or parents. Supervisor Barrett noted there were about 150 students involved in Youth Court last year.

REPORT TO THE BOARD

Stormwater Management Technician Scott Reese reported on Hazardous Waste Day held September 12th. He noted over 25 CERT, ECC and Town Board volunteers helped out. He reported 495 people registered. He said medical waste and syringes were brought in and the town needs to get the word out as to where medical waste can be brought to be discarded. Mr. Reese continued over 450 cans of latex paint were tagged and not accepted, however, about two cubic yards got past inspection which will cost less than \$800 to dispose of. Supervisor Barrett commended Mr. Reese on a successful day and thanked Beverly Czub for feeding the volunteers and former Councilman Sandy Roth for continuing to take part in the program. Residents from the towns of Malta, Ballston and Halfmoon participated in the day.

PUBLIC PRIVILEGE ON RESOLUTIONS

Supervisor Barrett presented the Historic Designation Plaque to Marylou and Hank Tetreault, owners of the William Peters House and thanked them for adding their property to the Historic Register. He noted this also gives them the opportunity to apply for the Historic Conservation Easement program.

Resolution No. 207 of 2015, a resolution designating the William Peters House to be placed on the Clifton Park Town Register of Historic Places.

Introduced by Councilman Whalen, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilwoman Standaert.

WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Commission has recommended that the William Peters House, 1773 Crescent Road, Rexford, NY (SBL 288.-1-6.12), be added to the Town Register of Historic Places, and

WHEREAS, structures placed on this Register will be given historic status for purposes of Town-wide recognition and as such shall be provided with appropriate marker and inclusion in a Town brochure identifying all sites so designated; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby adds the William Peters House, 1773 Crescent Road, Rexford, NY to the Town Register of Historic Places.

Councilman Whalen said the Tetreaults have spent a considerable amount of time in refurbishing their home and commended the Historic Conservation Commission for all their work involved in this designation.
