A. Hours of Operation for General Public:

CLOSED – *Sunday and Monday*

- B. The Town Board may close the Convenience Transfer Station on other days or times.
- C. Permits will be issued at the Convenience Transfer Station and the Buildings & Grounds office (limited time), 2 Town Hall Plaza, for ALL residents. Regular, Senior Citizen, Social Security Disability, Disabled American Vets and out of town.
- D. Permits will no longer be issued at the Town Clerk's Office.**
- E. All vehicles will STOP for a permit check by the attendant.
- F. Permit required for household garbage only, C&D and furniture separate fee, recycling center is free.
- G. No smoking in the Convenience Transfer Station.
- H. No ashes are to be dumped in garbage hopper.
- I. No burning barrels will be accepted.
- J. No person(s) age 13 or under will be allowed out of the vehicles while at the Convenience Transfer Station.
- K. No animal of any kind will be allowed out of the vehicles while at the Convenience Transfer Station.
- L. Refuse will be dumped at the designated marked places throughout the Convenience Transfer Station.
- M. No scavenging or picking will be allowed at the Convenience Transfer Station at any time.
- N. No hazardous waste of any kind will be allowed at the Convenience Transfer Station.
- O. If a primary permit holder loses the punch card or does not have their punch card with them, they can pay two dollars (\$2.00) for each bag deposited. If you have used up all the punches on the cards, you can pay two dollars (\$2.00) per bag. We will sell additional punch cards at \$2/punch in \$20 increments as well.
- P. Only brush or logs 6" in diameter or smaller and no longer than 4' in length will be accepted.

CONVENIENCE TRANSFER STATION PERMITTING PROVISIONS

The fee for each such annual primary permit, May 1 – April 30, shall be one hundred-ten (\$110.00) dollars for town residents and one hundred sixty (\$160.00) dollars for non-residents, payable in advance to the attendant or to such other persons as the Town Board may designate. The primary permit may be issued at any time during the year upon payment of the referenced fees.

A senior citizen's annual primary permit May 1 – April 30, shall be fifty-five (\$55.00) dollars payable in advance to the Transfer Station representative or at the Buildings & Grounds office (2 Town Hall Plaza). A senior citizen is defined, for purposes of this law, as an individual sixty-five (65) years of age and over. The primary permit may be issued at any time during the year upon payment of the referenced fees.

Any resident of the Town of Clifton Park, regardless of age, who is receiving Social Security Disability payments or is a Disabled American Veteran, upon proof of such status, payable in advance to the Transfer Station representative or at the Buildings & Grounds office (2 Town Hall Plaza), an annual, May 1 – April 30, permit fee of fifty (\$50.00) dollars. The primary permit may be issued at any time during the year upon payment of the referenced fees.

Upon purchase of the annual primary permit, May 1 – April 30, each purchaser shall receive one (1) punch card consisting of one hundred (100) punches per card. Each punch shall entitle the owner of the primary permit to deposit one (1) thirty-six (36) gallon bag of refuse or three (3) thirteen (13) gallon kitchen bags. Two (2) fifty (50) punch cards are available upon request.

A primary permit holder may opt to pay two dollars (\$2.00) for the deposit of a thirty-six (36) gallon bag or its equivalent at the convenience Transfer Station, after primary permit holder's punch cards are used up. Punch cards for additional bags may be purchased in \$20.00 increments as well.

CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION MATERIALS – NO PERMIT REQUIRED

I. All final decisions on rates and total price charged will be made by the person in charge of the Convenience Transfer Station at that time.

(A) Rate is based on cost to dump C & D.

(B) It takes approximately 6 – 30-gallon cans or bags for 1 cubic yard.

(C) Rate: 30-gallon bag or can \$8.00 minimum

6 bags or cans = 1 cubic yard - \$48.00

(D) Loose rate: All loads will be measured and calculated to the nearest cubic yard.

II. Disposal of Tires – Rates

WHAT TO DO WITH HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Next Household Hazardous Waste Day To be held September 2025

Aerosol Containers

Empty containers can be discarded with household trash. If contents are non-hazardous, spray outdoors into cardboard box allowing contents to dry.

Automotive

Anti-freeze -

Accepted at the Transfer Station.

Automotive Fluids –

Brake fluid, power steering, transmission fluid is accepted at the Transfer Station.

Diesel & Kerosene –

Accepted at the Transfer Station, or bring to a service station, or next Household Hazardous Waste Day.

Used Oil –

Accepted at the Transfer Station.

Batteries

Alkaline –

If the (AAA, AA, C, D) battery were purchased after 1992 it can be discarded with household trash.

Automotive –

Automotive battery retailers have been required to accept automotive lead-acid batteries. Also, can be brought over to the scrap metal section at the Transfer Station.

Button / Watch –

To be disposed at the next Household Hazardous Waste Day.

Lithium –

To be disposed at next Household Hazardous Waste Day.

Rechargeable –

Retailers that sell rechargeable batteries are required to accept used rechargeable batteries from consumers.

Driveway Sealers

If the label says it contains petroleum distillates or coal tar, then bring to the next Household Hazardous Waste Day. If it does not contain either contaminants, then dry out and dispose in ordinary trash. The Transfer Station accepts empty driveway sealer buckets.

Electronics, Computer Components & Televisions

The Transfer Station accepts most computer components and accessories. Older (CRT) Cathode Ray Tube TVs are accepted with a fee. See web page: <http://www.cliftonpark.org/index.php/2-uncategorised/91-electronic-recycling> for further details.

Fire Extinguishers

Fully discharged fire extinguishers can be brought over to the scrap metal section at the Transfer Station.

Household Cleaners – nontoxic or corrosive materials

Best to be used as directed on packaging or as most mentioned items in this flier, give to a friend / neighbor that can use it.

Gas Cylinders

Need to be completely empty. Can be brought over to the scrap metal section at the Transfer Station.

Lights

Compact Fluorescent Lights (CFL) Recycled with local hardware store or at place of purchase.

Fluorescent Light Tubes –

Can be brought to Wolberg Lighting Design & Electric Supply – 35 Industrial Park Road, Albany, where they will collect for a fee. Otherwise, save for the next Household Hazardous Waste Day.

Incandescent Bulbs –

Manufactured after 1978 can be thrown out in household trash.

Mercury Thermostats

Homeowners can bring their mercury thermostats to Thermal Environment Sales, Inc., 11 Sitterly Road, Clifton Park, or save for Household Hazardous Waste Day.

Paints

Aerosol –

Should be saved for the next Household Hazardous Waste Day or empty can and then dispose of in trash.

Latex –

Can be dropped off every Thursday. Between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm

Oil-base –

Some can be dropped off every Thursday at PaintCare. Save for the next Household Hazardous Waste day

Pesticides

Save for the next Household Hazardous Waste Day.

Prescription Drugs

The DEA organizes bi-annual medication take-back day, usually in April and October. For times and locations see: https://www.deadiversion.usdoj.gov/drug_disposal/takeback/

Sharps

Bring used needles to Seton Health at Schuyler Ridge Residential Healthcare – 1 Abele Drive, Clifton Park, on Wednesdays 9:00 AM – 2:30 PM.

Smoke Alarms

Manufacturers are now accepting smoke alarms for recycling, see package for instructions. If not see <https://www.curieservices.com/product-category/homeowner/> for other recycle options.

Swimming Pool Chemicals

Save for the next Household Hazardous Waste Day.

Thinners / Strippers

Save for the next Household Hazardous Waste Day.

Tires

When purchasing new tires, the old tires can be left at the retail store. However, the retailer will usually charge a nominal fee to cover the disposal cost. The Transfer Station accepts tires for a fee.

Other items to save for the next Household Hazardous Waste Day.

Toxic or corrosive cleaning materials, metal polish, wood polishes, waxes, mothballs, septic tank cleaners, and drain openers.

What is NOT accepted at the Household Hazardous Waste Day?

Explosives, alkaline batteries, ammunition, asbestos, bulk metal, construction and demolition debris, empty containers, empty paint cans, empty aerosol cans, empty refrigerant cans, empty propane tanks, unserviceable extinguishers, household medical waste, latex paint, radioactive material, rechargeable batteries, smoke detectors, tires, used oil, and electrical items.
